MEET STEPHEN R. FOERSTER



<u>Stephen R. Foerster</u> is an award-winning author and professor of finance at the Ivey Business School at Western University in London, Ontario, Canada. His latest book, *Trailblazers, Heroes, and Crooks: Stories to Make You a Smarter Investor*, is from Wiley (September 2024).

Foerster's prior book, *In Pursuit of the Perfect Portfolio: The Stories, Voices, and Key Insights of the Pioneers Who Shaped the Way We Invest* (with Andrew Lo, MIT Sloan School), Princeton University Press, 2021, was featured in *The Wall Street Journal's* Bookshelf column and won the Axiom Business Awards silver medal in Personal Finance and Investing. He is currently writing the authorized biography of William Sharpe, 1990 recipient of the Nobel Prize in Economics.

Foerster has also written two textbooks and over 100 case studies and technical notes in the areas of investments and financial management. He has published over 50 articles including in the *Journal of Financial Economics*, the *Journal of Finance* and *Financial Analysts Journal*. Foerster has served on pension and endowment fund boards as well as not-for-profit investment committees. He received a PhD in Finance from the Wharton School, University of Pennsylvania and has obtained the Chartered Financial Analyst designation. He was the founding co-director of Ivey's Women in Asset Management program.
